### GOSPEL

Matthew 6: 25 — 34

Jesus taught his disciples, saying: 'Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you – you of little faith? Therefore do not worry, saying, "What will we eat?" or "What will we drink?" or "What will we wear?" For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. #### **SAFEGUARDING**

Our churches and church-related activities must be safe for all, with safeguarding policies and practices that promote a safer church. **FLOOR REPAIR PROJECT.** Following discussions with the Oxford Buildings Committee (DAC), Historic England and The Victorian Society we have been given permission to go ahead with the project, subject to any comments from anyone. To permit this a Public Notice has been posted on the external notice board and at the back of the church on behalf of the Diocese and they need to remain there for one month. All three organisations will continue to keep a close eye on what we are doing but of course it all depends on raising enough funds to pay for it. Following the fantastic money pledged from the project launch on 22 September last we are seeking further grants from other organisations, not an easy road, but anyone can still pledge. I will keep you posted on progress but please don't hesitate to ask me about anything.

**West End Re-ordering.** When we launched the floor project we also explained that we were planning to improve our welcome to visitors and the quality of our socializing by changing the back of the church with cupboards to store some of the items currently on display, to house the altar frontals in place of the current mismatched two frontal chests, to lay on running water and a sink, and to provide café-style tables and chairs. Some pews will be moved elsewhere to make room. We are in discussion with the Diocese about the plans, which have been approved by the PCC, but in the meantime Maidenhead Rowing Club, through the good offices of Paul Lion, have offered us a few tables and chairs as a trial. We hope to install them in the near future, and to move two pews from behind the cross aisle to in front of the cross aisle to facilitate it. At the moment this is a trial so by all means let Fr. Jeremy or myself know what you think when the trial is set up. There are some pictures on the board at the back.
