NEWS FROM THE BELLTOWER

We are very pleased to tell you that the bells are ringing again. Thank you for all the donations that helped make this possible. As part of the repair work we have identified some other pressing maintenance issues which we hope to address in the very near future. One of these is to consider a shelter/roof above the bells. Most of you won't know that high up in the spire there are windows and openings to allow the structure to breathe but the downside is that rainwater is coming in at times and this is accelerating the corrosion and rusting of the metal parts of the bell frame and bell fittings. The recent problem with number five bell was in part due to this exposure to rainwater. On the day the repair was completed on number five bell it rained heavily and in the belfry you could have had a shower. Consequently we will be looking to see if this can be resolved to protect the bells and frame from further accelerated corrosion, the work goes on!
