### Holy Week 2021

Palm Sunday is the start of the most important week in the Christian Calendar - **Holy Week**.

For the second year running we will not be able to use the beautiful All Saints Church due in part to the consequences of the pandemic but also because we have begun work on restoring the floor of George Street's wonderful building.

Mike Moss, Jeanette Lock and I have given time to try to offer you the opportunity to share Holy Week in a different but hopefully creative way. Palm Sunday and the 'Triduum' will be shared via Zoom . The Paschal Triduum' (triih-dyoo-um), Latin for 'Three Days', commemorates Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

For those of you seeking services where we physically gather to share the Eucharist we will be offering services at 7.30pm on Monday and Tuesday and at 10.00am on Wednesday of Holy Week. On Easter Morning there will be three Eucharists throughout the day at 10.00am, 11.30am and 6.00pm. With limited spaces you will need to book a place to receive Easter Holy Communion.

On Palm Sunday we will be sharing the 10.00am Morning Prayer on zoom with the Blessing of the Palms. The service will include the Open the Book story of Palm Sunday.

On Maundy Thursday we welcome Fr Nicholas Cheeseman, the Area Director of Ordinands for Berkshire and Oxford, who will be our preacher.

On Good Friday we will listen to an old friend of All Saints, Fr Kevin Scully, as he shares his thoughts on Good Friday through the Stations of the Cross.

On Holy Saturday we will share Easter Ceremonies again on Zoom but with many of the familiar parts of the service recorded for us to take part in.

During the services on the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday I will share meditations from Rowan Williams 'Candles in the Dark'. These were written during the first Lockdown last April.

Those of us that have planned the Holy Week worship do hope that everyone will find a chance to take part, even in a small way in the most important week in the Christian year. Holy Week is not an historical pageant but a living liturgy. We hope that this year although we still cannot share this powerful week within the church we can gather in different ways as the Body of Christ to experience this spiritual journey.

Please take note of the dates, times and ways of sharing Holy Week so that you can ready to take part in the great Christian drama.

#### What happened?

Jesus held a Last Supper with his disciples, when he washed their feet, asked them to receive his Holy Communion, and commanded them to love one another. Following that, he went and prayed until his arrest.

#### Why is it important?

When we are able to we receive Jesus' Body and Blood in Holy Communion, and we can join in his death and in his new, risen life. As we witness the washing of the feet, we are reminded of the need to love and serve one another.

#### How can we join in?

By joining the Zoom service and witnessing the foot washing. You might like to have ready at home some honey, some lemon juice and some herbs. The bitter sweet taste reminds us of the experiences of the Israelite people in slavery in Egypt before the Passover to the promised Land.

You might also like to have a towel and water ready as you symbolically wash your hands or feet during this service.

Following the Zoom service you can go to keep watch in the Parish Centre from 9.00pm until 11.50pm when Night Prayer will be shared.

#### What happened?

Following his arrest and trial by religious and political figures we hear how Jesus died on the Cross.

#### Why is it important?

Jesus died to show that God is involved in all of our lives and takes all the sin and death of the world onto himself. This tells us that Jesus is with us in our own struggles in life even at our death. What appears to be a terrible defeat leads to new Life.

#### How can we join in?

Join the zoom service which will involve us sharing in a moving Stations of the Cross with powerful music followed by The Passion Readings. Fr Kevin Scully will then offer us a Good Friday sermon based on the Stations of the Cross before we finish by praying in front of the cross as we listen to reflective music.

#### Why is it important?

We see the Paschal Candle shining brightly in the darkness reminding us of light overcoming darkness, goodness overcoming evil and New Life overcoming death.

We will hear the stories of creation, Passover, and of the prophecy of a man who will bring New Life. We will light the

candle from the fire and people at home can light their own candles as we listen to the Exsultet.

We will share our Baptism promises and proclaim our belief in the Risen Lord. We promise to live lives that reflect the light of Christ to the World.

Following this service we can share from our homes celebratory drinks and snacks.
